

Anita Harris has become quite well known around the traps for her impeccable vocal style and here is her latest CD of well known standards interspersed with some less well known but good songs that her fans will enjoy very much. Anita sings beautifully with spot-on accuracy in pitch and diction.

The backing group is made up of some of Melbourne's best known and most able musos with her father Kim leading the group at the piano. The band arrangements provide good variation in colour with the horns of Graeme Steel (open or muted trumpet) and Ron Trigg (flute, tenor sax or clarinet), the bass of Leon Heale (one of Melbourne's top bassists) and the very neat sympathetic drumming of Alan Richards.

Anita's choice of songs gives a wide variation of swingers and ballads – she must have one of the broadest repertoires since Ella, this being her fourth album!

Rather than pick out any highlights, I found I enjoyed all the tracks on this CD and I recommend you give it a listen if you enjoy the work of singers of the jazz or 'easy listening' style and I'm sure you will enjoy this album.
